

DECEMBER FIN FACTS



Christmas tree worms: Spirobranchus Giganteus.

The Christmas tree worm is a marine worm that lives on tropical coral reefs around the world.

Candy cane shrimp: Alpheus Randalli.

The candy cane shrimp shares its space with the goby fish. They dig burrows for the fish to rest in and the fish protects and guides the mostly blind shrimp.





Jingle Shells: Anomiidae. Jingle shells are closely related to scallops and oysters. They are also known as mermaid's toenails.

Peppermint Angelfish: Centropyge Boylei.

The peppermint angelfish is one of the rarest creatures in the ocean. They only grow to about 7 centimeters long but live up to 120 meters below the surface of the ocean.





Christmas Wrasse: Thalassoma Trilobatum. The Christmas wrasse is also known as the ornamented wrasse. They can grow up to 11 inches long.



Marine Snow:

Marine snow is a continuous shower of organic material falling from the upper levels of the ocean. It is made up of many things such as sand, parts of dead plants, soot, and even fish poop!




Can you find the matching sea animals in the snow globe?

Ingredients:

- 6 cups popped popcorn
- 8 ounces white candy coating
- 1 ½ cups Goldfish pretzels
- 5 ounces M&Ms
- 5 ounces miniature marshmallows
- ¹/₄ cup sprinkles
- Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper
- Place popcorn on the baking sheet Melt the candy coating according to the package directions
- Pour the candy coating over the popcorn and begin tossing with tongs to evenly coat
- Continue tossing and add the remaining ingredients, starting with the Goldfish and M&Ms
- Spread the snack mix evenly on the baking sheet and let sit for 30 minutes Break apart and serve
- Store the leftovers in an airtight container
