

FIN FACTS

Manatees are also known as sea cows They are solitary animals

About 50% of their time is spent sleeping while submerged

They are extremely gentle creatures They are aquatic mammals that are herbivores

Their bones are solid and heavy, which makes it easier for them to get to the bottom

They are closely related to elephants- they have a trunk, tough skin, and bristle-like hair on their body

Manatees never leave the water
If they remain in freshwater for a long time,
algae will grow on their backs
They are listed as "threatened" on the
Endangered Species Act
They are threatened by habitat
degradation, human harassment, and boat
collisions.

How can we help? Keep their habitat clean. Recycle fishing line. Be aware of your surroundings while operating boats on the waterways. Obey all posted waterway signs.





When a manatee has spent a long period of time in fresh water, algae often begins to grow on its back. Although it might seem uncomfortable, the manatee doesn't mind the algae covering its body. It acts like a sunscreen!
